- Established in 1998
- Six total sites across four counties with 12 participating high schools
- School within a school model
 - Half day program at 3 different sites within Stafford County focused on core content areas (mathematics, science, English, resid ctudies) social studies)

- StatfordHS
 In order to participate in CGS, students must transfer and become a full-time student at the CGS site high school.
 Starting with the Class of 2028 (current 8° graders), the highest scoring students will be assigned to their CGS site based on their home address (NOT by their zoned high school).

- Focused on helping students see the connections between content areas and learning big picture concepts
- · Access to real-world, relevant learning experiences in all content areas

Overview (continued)

- Implementation of a Gifted Instructional Model
 - Pace
 - CGS courses move at a much faster pace than the same course in a comprehensive high school allowing students to feel challenged as they work through new material.
 - Process
 - Focus on critical thinking skills that allow students to problem-solve, analyze, and dissect material, primary documents, and apply their content knowledge to new situations
 - - Students are provided choice and options when completing assignments and projects. They often choose the type of product and the content of the assignment (within a theme) in order to demonstrate their mastery.

Eligibility

- Gifted or high-achieving students AND highly motivated learners
- Students in grades 9-12
- Must successfully complete Algebra I by the end of the spring in 8th grade to be eligible to apply
- CGS utilizes a meritbased application model, which is unique amongst all high school programs offered in Stafford County.

Culminating Project



- Research project
- Focused on student's personal interest
- Receive an elective credit at the conclusion of 12th grade
- Opportunity to work with an expert in selected field of research
- Intersession model that allows students to work exclusively on research throughout the school year


